GRANT INFORMATION

The Old Town Triangle Association offers grants to schools and organizations that serve our community and support the stated mission and goals of the Old Town Triangle Association, which appear below.

Grant applications are accepted semi-annually. Applications can either be downloaded from the OTTA website, the 43rd ward website or picked up at the OTTA office located at 1763 N. North Park Avenue, Chicago, IL 60614. Proposals are evaluated on a semi-annual basis, with application deadlines on April 15 and November 15 of each year. Applications submitted for the April deadline will be awarded in late May. Applications submitted for the November deadline will be awarded in late December. An applicant may not submit a grant request more than once in a 12-month time period.

When filling out the application please include all requested information. Each section must be complete in order to be considered. OTTA Mission Statement and Goals
