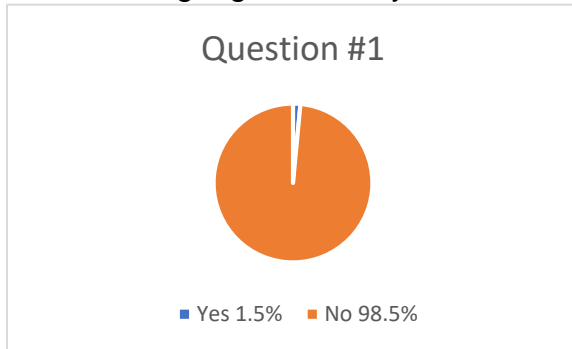
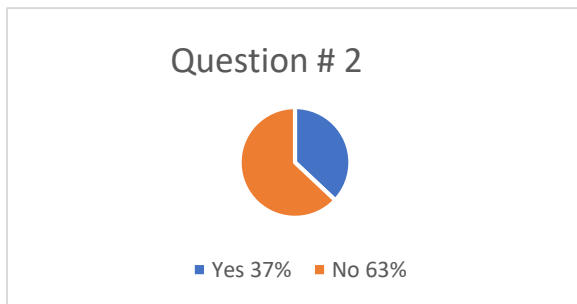

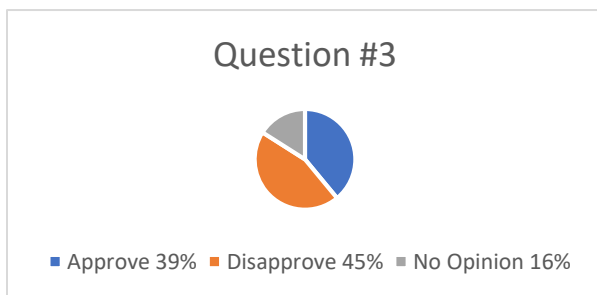
Q.1 - Do you have a child enrolled at LaSalle Language Academy?



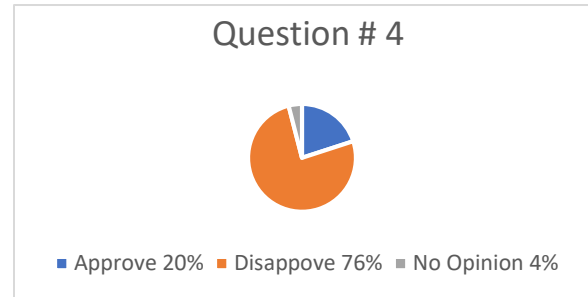
Q.2 - Do your children/grandchildren use the LaSalle playground?



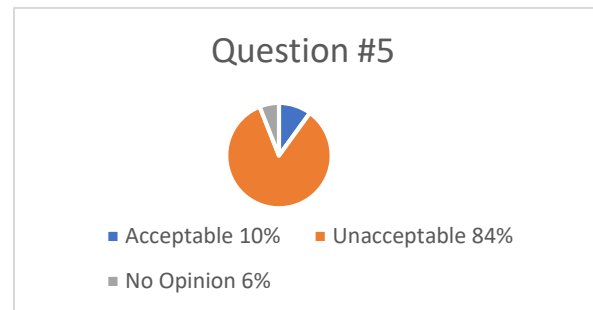
Q.3 - LaSalle School plans to convert the existing playground into an artificial turn soccer field. Do you:



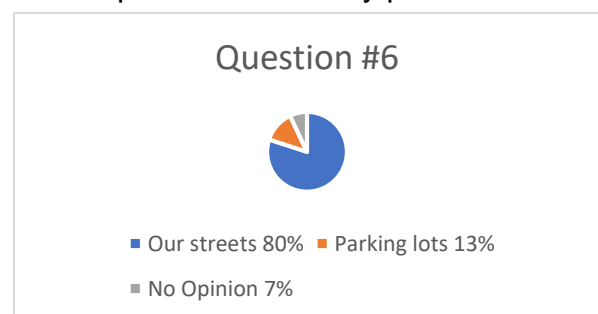
Q.4 - LaSalle School plans to rent the proposed soccer field to various groups/clubs who may come from outside of our neighborhood. Do you:



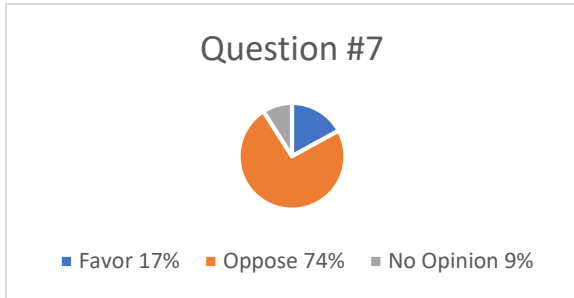

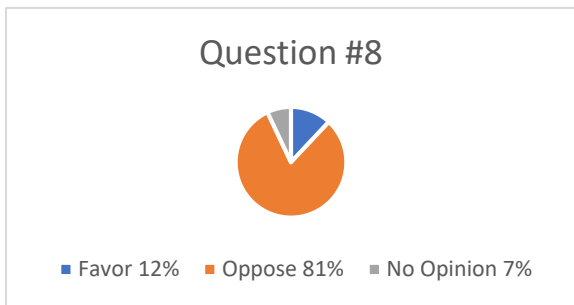

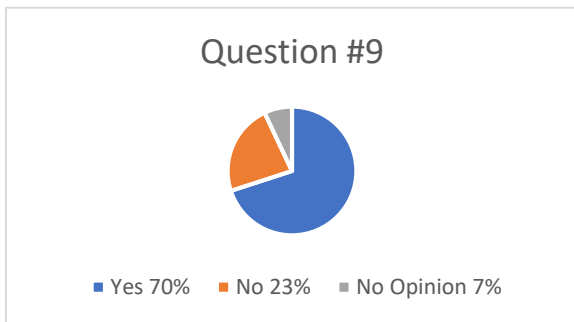
Q.7 - What is your opinion of: Saturday & Sunday rentals (9 am-3 pm) of the proposed soccer field? Allowing 4-5 games:



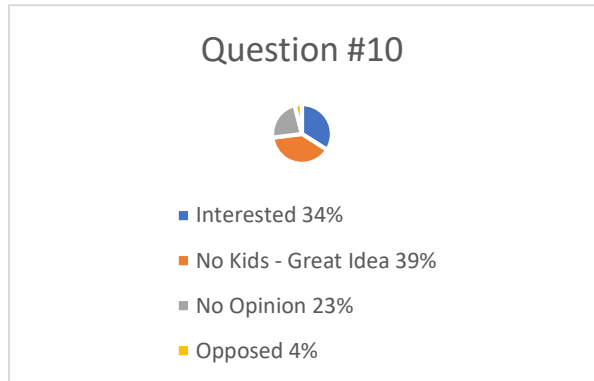
Q.8 - Weeknight rentals (4:30 pm-9 pm) of the proposed soccer field? This is the time most people arrive home from work.
