*In the case of inclement weather, the workshop will be held indoors of Triangle Center (Old Town Art Center, 1763 N. North Park Ave, Chicago) and the participants will paint from their personal photo reference selected ahead of time.

Workshop description:

This workshop is designed for both the beginners and the experienced plein air painters.

The beginners will be introduced to the fundamentals of plein air painting.

Those who have previous experience in plein air painting will expand their proficiency in plein air painting with emphasis on dynamic composition and color harmony in outdoor painting.

- Learning Objectives: through group and individual instruction, participants will gain knowledge in, and produce a painting that demonstrates hands-on understanding of,
- 1. essential material and tools of plein air painting.
- 2. considerations in deciding what to paint (and what *not* to paint) and where to paint from.
- 3. fundamentals of painting; composition, drawing accuracy, tonal dynamics, color harmony.
- 4. practical tips and advice in plein air painting.

Instructional methods:

Workshop is comprised of instructor lecture, demonstration, and the participants working independently with the guidance of the instructor as he makes rounds of instruction for individual sketchers. Workshop will conclude with group critique of their finished paintings.

- Workshop schedule:
- · 10am–12pm: Introduction to material, instructor demo, participants disperse and paint.
- · 12pm–1pm: Lunch (individual and flexible schedule)
- · 1pm-4pm: Continue and finish painting.
- · 4pm—5pm: Group critique and conclusion.
