- *In the case of inclement weather, the workshop will be held indoors of Triangle Center (Old Town Art Center, 1763 N. North Park Ave, Chicago) and the participants will sketch the scenes within the Center and objects available in it.
- Workshop description:

This workshop is designed for both the beginners and the experienced urban sketchers.

- Learning Objectives:
- 1. The beginners will be introduced to fundamentals of urban sketching.
- 2. Experienced urban sketchers will expand their competency in skills and techniques of urban sketching.
- 3. Participants will be familiarized with various sketching materials and tools in urban sketching.
- 4. Participants will gain knowledge of practical tips and advice in urban sketching.
- Instructional methods:

Workshop is comprised of instructor lecture, demonstration, and the participants working independently with the guidance of the instructor as he makes rounds of instruction for individual sketchers. Workshop will conclude with group critique of their sketches.

- Workshop schedule:
- · 10am–11am: Introduction to concept and principles of urban sketching, material, instructor demo.
- · 11am-12pm: participants disperse and sketch.
- · 12pm–1pm: Lunch (individual and flexible schedule)
- · 1pm-4pm: Continue and finish sketching.
- · 4pm—5pm: "Throw Down", group critique, and conclusion.
